SENATOR KELLY: If I understand correctly there is no limit as to what they can charge for the FOB or for the delivered price.

SENATOR CARPENTER: That is right.

SENATOR KELLY: That they can set the Scotts Bluff rate on what they deliver in Omaha.

SENATOR CARPENTER: If you want to project like that, that is true.

SENATOR KELLY: Alright thank you.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Senator Goodrich, on the issue.

SENATOR GOODRICH: There is one main problem with this particular amendment then and that is the fact that it prohibits the operator from going and getting it himself if he wants to. He has no alternative. He has to get it from a common carrier, gets delivery from a common carrier. He is prohibited from delivering his own, or going to get his own or even forming a group within a given area to jointly send a truck in to get what they want if they don't want to pay the common carrier rates. For that reason, I would suggest that this is not the greatest amendment that we ever proposed.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I can understand your position. I can understand why you are making all of these expectations. Personally I don't care whether you adopt the amendment or not. I am only trying to make the amendment more acceptable to those people who may be more directly affected by it. I would hope that you would adopt the amendment. If you don't it makes no difference to me, we can leave it just exactly like it is. I would presume that you do not have enough votes to mutilate this bill in order to help those people who have contacted you for this specific purpose.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Senator Marsh, do you wish the floor? Any further discussion? Motion is to return LB111 to Select File for the specific amendment. If you wish the amendment read again? If not, all those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. It takes 25 votes. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 12 Ayes, and 9 nays Mr. President.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Motion lost. What is the next bill?

SENATOR SIMPSON: Senator Proud.
