motion, Senator Burbach. Chair recognizes Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. I would like to suggest that any of the bills that need to be brought back, be considered at this time before 526, 29, 30 and 114. I don't think it will take long but I think it will, it will hasten the responsibility of the work load of our Clerk and of the Bill Drafter and so I move that, ask unanimous consent that we consider those items at this time.

PRESIDENT: Very good. Senator Burbach is asking unanimous consent that we take up a series of motions to return bills to select file for specific amendments here before we launch into the discussion on 526 in view of the workload of just the behind-the-scenes administration here. Are there objections to handling those, that series of motions now? Hearing none, so ordered then, we'll take them up in that order. We have motions, the first one there is by Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. I move to return LB 533 to select file for a specific amendment and that amendment being to strike Section 7 of the bill which is an amendment that was put on by Senator Car--Clark with no opposition at the time. The amendment that Senator Clark placed on the bill and I knew about it, was it would not permit the junior colleges or vocational technical schools to enter into any construction contract until the new board was appointed. Now this sounds very reasonable and I think that's why it was adopted, that we should let the new boards do the work, but we have a specific problem out in the North Platte area. There was a lady there that died a few years ago and she left a certain amount of money, over a million dollars, to the junior college there at North Platte, but it has to be spent by the junior college board and they're within, oh, they're within two weeks of entering into a new contract to spend this money that this lady has left, otherwise the bequest will lapse and go somewhere else and so it is, this amendment created some specific problems for North Platte and I don't think there'd be any objections from the other areas to taking the Clark amendment off and I know Senator Clark, I know personally that he would--guarantee personally that he would not object to taking this amendment off and so I would like to return it, it's very simple, we just strike that small section and as Senator Carpenter says, the computer is working and I don't think it will delay this bill hardly at all because they'll just have to replace the last couple pages, well the last page and a half to this bill so I move this bill return and this amendment be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Alright, motion is to return the bill now. Senator Whitney, did you want to be heard on the motion?

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, I'd like to ask Senator Waldron a question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Waldron, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR WHITNEY: Now, is this for the purpose of building a new building in a given location?

SENATOR WALDRON: Yes it is, the will, her will had stated that the building should be, would be, the money given to
