

do you want this to happen in your county of another re-appraisal without the permission of the people in the county. Now I am talking about the people..the voters in which a majority of those people will make a determination of whether or not they want a reappraisal taken by anybody, whether it is the state or by an appraisal company, or anybody. Now in my county of Scottsbluff, they went through a lot of pain and when they got through, do you know who wanted the reappraisal? The County Commissioners. Do you know why they wanted it? They are right up against the mill levy and that's the only way they could get more money, to raise the valuation. That's exactly what happened. You see if you can't raise the mill levy, the next step, of course, in a county who wants more money is to raise the valuation because that is the only way you can get it. If you keep the valuations based what they are with the adjustments from time to time on new property and the isolated cases, that's the way I think it ought to be kept. If you feel differently, it really doesn't make any particular difference to me as long as you have been alerted to what you might do.

SPEAKER: Did you have a question, Senator Burbach. We did not close debate..we did not close..vote to close debate, therefore, you have a right to only ask question.

SENATOR BURBACH: Oh, this was a closing.

SPEAKER: Yes, he has already closed.

SENATOR BURBACH: Senator Carpenter, you are aware that we are only talking of eight counties now, not the other counties, in your county and my county, for example, only the eight to conclude this work. You remember LB 84 done away with any other appraisal. Is this correct?

SENATOR CARPENTER: If you want to have it apply to the eight counties which haven't been reappraised, I would be very happy to make that exception in there.

SENATOR BURBACH: I think that's provided for under LB 84 of '71, maybe, which stopped all other reappraisals except that we proceed with the remaining counties. And we are down to eight and now I am sure that in following LB 84, there is no other county involved, only the remaining eight counties, Senator.

SENATOR CARPENTER: And did you say in this bill, for example, that it only applies to the eight counties?

SPEAKER: Senator Stull, did you have a question of Senator Carpenter? That's the only thing the chair will recognize since we did not close debate.

SENATOR STULL: Now I understand you are just talking about the amendment?

SPEAKER: No, Senator Carpenter closed.

SENATOR STULL: On the amendment.

SPEAKER: Yes.

SENATOR STULL: I want to talk on the bill.
