

a county is so bad that the Tax..the Revenue Director or that particular county would call for one. That would be the only other cases, only the eight counties in the state unless there would be one extremely bad, then, he would call one.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: The Tax Commissioner, of course, under the present authority, as I recall, could do that in any case. All I want the assurance that this bill in any form in so far as what we are talking about doesn't apply to any other county outside of the eight counties. If you give me that assurance, that is good enough for me.

SPEAKER: Senator Burbach, another question.

SENATOR BURBACH: Well, an answer, in reply to his question there. He asked if I would give him that assurance. Senator Carpenter, I don't know under the broad authorities we have given to the Tax Commissioner. I don't visualize that this would happen. That we have LB 84 so that these counties continuously upgrade and up..keep current valuations and if they do not, then the Tax Commissioner can go in and do this and charge the county for it. And I presume this would be the only area where....

SENATOR CARPENTER: At that point, that's already in the law and I have no desire to amend or do anything to that exception but with that exception, you assure me it doesn't apply to anything except the other eight counties.

SENATOR BURBACH: It is not intended to and I am certain that will not apply to anything only the eight counties that we have under a moratorium at the present time.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Then, Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to withdraw the amendment.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter has asked unanimous consent to withdraw the amendment to LB 530. Any objections? I see no objection, so it is ordered.

CLERK: Now the further Carpenter amendment, Mr. President, is to amend--read.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Now, Mr. President, this amendment and I hope there is no objection to this, requires that the state..county assessors each year publish a list of all the tax exempt property with the exception of that owned by legally incorporated areas of government. Now the reason for this is that there is a lot of property, probably, which has never been subjected to the information of the general public. All this would do, that once every year in a paper within that particular county of general circulation would publish a list giving the name and the value and the location of real property in that county which is tax exempt. I think it would create a healthy condition and it may not result in any more being put on the rolls, but

the people would have the information where they could make up their own mind as to whether or not it was. I move for the adoption of the amendment.
