

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on enrollment and review reports (Read) signed John Cavanaugh, Chairman. Now we come to the motion Mr. President, asks unanimous consent to unbracket LB 10 on select file and consider an amendment, signed Senator Warner.

PRESIDENT: Thank-you. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: I visited with Senators, LB 10 is Senator Stahmers bill, I visited with him. He does not object to having the bill unbracketed and then I would offer the an amendment, which would strip the bill, strike the two sections and insert the sections relative to the reduction of the income tax rate for this year, for 15 to 13. Some of the Senators were not able to be in the chamber yesterday, when the issue was discussed. They have indicated they would like to have an opportunity to vote on it. I don't know that I need to make a great deal of discussion. We discussed it to some length yesterday, there is no question but what, from the stand point of adequate funds in the treasury. It can be done, only the legislature can do it and it seems to me that certainly when taxes can be reduced, they ought to be reduced in the year in which they were, the return was high, in order that each person can personally receive back the amount that he was proportionately in effect, over charged. So with that comment Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to have the bill unbracketed and then I'll offer the amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Warner, is asking unanimous consent now to unbracket LB 10 on select file and take it up at this time. Are there objections? All right, fine that is all that is necessary then.

SENATOR SYAS: Then I would like to say why.

PRESIDENT: I don't think you need to if you object, that is just it.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, I'd like to have the senate know why, if I may.

PRESIDENT: Well, stand by, maybe he doesn't want to make a motion then, so go ahead and move and if not is the move questioned. Senator Warner, do you want to move?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I'll move the bill be unbracketed and Senator Syas can---

PRESIDENT: All right, the motion is before us, is to unbracket LB 10. Go ahead, Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Well that was the reason I wanted him to do it. I wanted him to do by vote. Now, I have not, I'm not going to lose any vote over LB 10 and I like the bill. It is going to be there till next session, but this is one of the things that I object to, like a lot of other things we do in this legislature. We gut bills and change them. This is what got us in trouble with the general public and it should, and we waste about an hour every morning on something else any how. This is what got us in trouble. There are a lot of things that next session, something has got to be done in this legislature, to speed up these things and get down to business. I know you are going to gut the bill but I wanted you to have to take a vote and not unanimous consent.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the motion? Question is shall LB 10 be unbracketed? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Motion before the body is to
