Question is shall 526 be returned to final reading? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed--excuse me--Senator Keyes, your light is on. Are you objecting? Question is shall the bill be moved to final reading? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. This is the motion to return 526 to final reading. Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 3 nays, 17 not voting, to return it to final reading.

PRESIDENT: Bill is readvanced to final reading. Now, Senator Keyes, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, I want to ask Senator Burbach a question if he will answer.

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes, I'm going to remind you that there is no issue before the body.

SENATOR KEYES: That's right--

PRESIDENT: At this particular time and if it's something that involves the whole body, fine but other than that

SENATOR KEYES: It does, it--

PRESIDENT: I think the Legislature is asking to press on here to final reading and if so, you can visit with Senator Burbach about the question.

SENATOR KEYES: I think this is important to the whole Legislature though.

PRESIDENT: Do you want to speak on a point of personal privilege?

SENATOR KEYES: Point of personal privilege--

PRESIDENT: Don't speak on a bill.

SENATOR KEYES: No I won't. Boy, you're tying me down Mr. Lieutenant Governor. Senator Burbach, we have a study committee in the Revenue which is going to study tax problems and I would like to have you state whether you think that this will be one of the problems that we will study, because it has a very great effect upon our state.

PRESIDENT: Do you want to answer him after we begin final reading, Senator Burbach?

SENATOR BURBACH: Have I got that much time to answer him in?

PRESIDENT: Go ahead--answer. Go on.

SENATOR BURBACH: Senator Keyes, as I mentioned yesterday when I mentioned about Senator Cal Carsten's bill about the exemption or exclusion of the motor vehicle registration fees on many of the departments, on the exemption we passed in 1972 for irrigation districts we exempt from a sales tax, all of these things are part of the things that we will study.
