true, I think we would possibly want to consider doing something with LB 311A, either in the amount it now is or in modified form to take care of this deficiency of Federal funds if, in fact, it is a fact and I have every reason to believe it is a fact and I just mentioned this to Senator Carpenter. Perhaps he'd like to put some input into this.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Now Mr. President, the only thing I can suggest of a practical nature is to unbracket, not unbracket but to read 311A. If what Senator Stahmer says is correct and I presume that it is, it would be a stop gap, it would not do as much as if we appropriated more money but certainly it would give them a reason maybe, to get through until we meet again in January so I think tomorrow, Senator, really being realistic about it, if you'd make the motion to read 311A if this body permits it. That would give about five hundred and some thousand dollars to offset the \$3,000,000, if that's the figure which is going to be withdrawn by the Federal Government.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Yes, I just now talked to Mr. Ehrlich and he tells me that we have a reprieve until October and that there is some chance that there will be an additional reprieve after that. No one yet still seems to be certain, but I would think if we did give some consideration tomorrow to, for instance, 311A, there would be some control I would imagine, by the Governor and if we didn't get this money, I, I definitely think we would be in a very, very terrible situation so I will raise the issue again tomorrow, Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: Senator Whitney, for what purpose did you want to be recognized?

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. We have four men to approve here on the Committee on Committees which are appointees by the Governor. They're not controversial at all and I'd like to ask that Ronald Woodward, William Dobler, William C. Peters, Francis Hanna, I'd like to ask unanimous consent to take all of these up at once.

PRESIDENT: Senator Whitney, the Chair, well, we have a motion to adjourn up here. Let's see if we can get unanimous consent to take them up. Are there any objections to handling these four appointments at this time, all at once? Any objections? Hearing none, so ordered. Go ahead, Senator Whitney.
