PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion of the motion? Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the legislature, you know LB 235 and 235A are my bills. I support Senator Chambers in his motion to unbracket the bills. I hope that you will support them. I agree with him in his explanation of the funding. You have not been lobbied by anyone on these bills. These bills have to stand on their own two feet. I think they can do so. I hope that you will support Senator Chambers and myself and unbracket the bills and vote to pass them.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the body, we showed great compassion when we passed 445 and 445A, for retirement for teachers and I know that we had it in our hearts, particularly for the elderly teachers in Nebraska. Let's use that same compassion in unbracketing 235 and 235A, and put some money in the family's pocket to feed the children in Nebraska. We are doing it with the elderly teachers, let's do it with the young poor children.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Fellman.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Members of the legislature, I am neither interested in drawing blood from Senator Chambers nor in donating blood to Senator Chambers. I think that his motion
