

SENATOR ANDERSON: Yesterday I in light of the fact that the Governor does have life or death control over some of the measures on Final Reading today, I asked him for a clarification of his opinion with regards to these things. I understand now the discussion is that we are going to dispense with the reading of communications. I do have a communication from the Governor and I have given it to the Clerk and I would like to have it put into the record. I will distribute this to the members and ask that you do take this into consideration in making a decision on these measures.

PRESIDENT: If we have that Senator Anderson, we will have that duplicated also and have it laid on the desks.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Mr. President, I have copies and I will get those distributed right away. Then Vince has a copy that he can put in the record.

PRESIDENT: Very good. Senator Carpenter for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CARPENTER: I want to make an exception to the motion that I made. To amend it I guess that Senator Warner apparently has some reason, which is valid, that he would like to override as I understand the Governor's veto of 472. With a that exception that we do that now and let some other member or unless another member has an objection I move that we consider that now and then take up on Final Reading without a suspension of rules the bills on final reading.

PRESIDENT: Now we have an amendment to the motion to suspend the rules. Read the bills on Final Reading with the exception of LB472. Senator Carpenter if we could get you to just stand by with the motion to suspend the rules so forth with that one then we can keep the record a little more clear here and we could just go ahead and take up Senator Warner's bill or a... motion to override and then we would be back where we are and I think in somewhat of an order. Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Yes, I would just like to ask a question. Doesn't the Senate even want to know what the Governor said about the bill before they vote? You won't have a chance to even read it. Senator Warner have a reason that he has got to...before we can even read the Governor's message...go ahead, I'm not going to object I just want to tell you that you are not even going to read the thing before you vote.

CLERK: Read motion.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President. members of the...

PRESIDENT: Just a minute now, lets make clear. Senator Syas it is my understanding that that letter is on your desk and also that that letter had already been read this morning.

SENATOR SYAS: Only the first page is on my desk. Now that is the way that I understand it.

PRESIDENT: OK, do you have the other page? Alright, Chair recognizes Senator Warner.
