This gives them the privilege of selecting a carrier that will more conveniently transport these documents so it is not only the price of negotiating but the convenience of shipping these documents. I think that it is necessary that we support the bill.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature I would like to bracket this until January 8. I would like unanimous consent to hold this until the 8th.

PRESIDENT: Any objections to bracketing LR8 until then? Senator Richendifer, do you object? OK, hearing none so ordered then. The Resolution is bracketed until January 8th. This brings up LB471. Senator Richendifer for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: I would like to ask unanimous consent to consider LB377 at this time. It will save some printing in the Journal. We have the amendments worked out for the back where they originally were. I ask unanimous consent to consider.
