SENATOR WARNER: What is the responsibility of the Committee:

SENATOR KEYES: Yes. I mean what type of legislation and what should the Education Committee concern itself mainly with.

SENATOR WARNER: I suppose all the factors that involve education and the right leadership, and of course the solution of those problems wherever they may occur in the state.

SENATOR KEYES: All right. Now Senator Warner what would you say would be the responsibilities of the Revenue Committee.

SENATOR WARNER: Of the Revenue Committee?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes.

SENATOR WARNER: I assume the Revenue Committee has responsibilities to review any proposals in the way of new forms of taxation, etc.

SENATOR KEYES: And spending this money is the responsibility of which committee.

SENATOR WARNER: The appropriations is by the Appropriations Committee and the formula under which it's distributed the enabling legislation would be the appropriate committee pertaining to the subject matter whether it was..program that's the way it works.

SENATOR KEYES: Well then Senator Warner. By what line of thinking would you ever conceive that the Education Committee to come up with a bill that is going to probably give us a 35 to 40% increase in the revenue, and is going to spend 60 to 70

to 80 or to 125 million dollars. What line of thinking do you put that in the Education Committee.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Keyes, as you know to start with rules of precedence that has been to my knowledge. Since I was a member of the Legislature it was there prior to that. I'm not sure what you're driving at.

SENATOR KEYES: I'm simply saying that if we go by precedence, then I would be riding a horse to town every morning instead of driving my car as long as there is gasoline. You see we don't run this state or we can't run anything by precedence. We have to do what is exactly right. And so I'm just trying to get some line of thinking whereby you think that the Education Committee should have the revenue producing bill and the revenue spending bill in the Education Committee.
