PRESIDENT: Senator Duis from the chamber.

CLERK: Mr. President there's a report of the Rules Committee found on pages 118 and 119 of the Legislative Journal. Submitted yesterday by the Rules Committee for rule changes which were pending from last year. Page 118 and 119 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, first let me thank the new system the intercom system in to the rooms..in to our offices because I had the opportunity to hearing the fact that this was coming up and was able to come back. These rule changes that were proposed and enacted upon during the last days of the last session were reaffirmed during the interim and so we're bringing them before the body at the present time. The first rule change if you would care to follow it (read) Actually all it does it takes out that part that says, Any legislative day that immediately following corrections of the daily journal. Gives them more time in which to do it and states how many votes it takes in order to make the objection. I would open this up and would ask for it to be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion on the rules change. Anybody want to be heard on the proposed rules change. Found on page 118 and 119 of the Journal. Any further discussion. Senator Duis do you have any closing then. The question is then should the rule be adopted. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. You are voting on the rules change as proposed by the Rules Committee as explained by Senator Duis. Involves the change of the rules as found on page 118 and 119 of the Journal. The chair would remind you that it takes 30 votes to change the rules. Once again have you all voted? O.K. take your time on it. Go ahead. Once again have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The rule change is adopted. We have another rule change. Read the rule change as proposed.

CLERK: Rule 3, Sec. 12 119 of the Legislative Journal all it does is delete the word (read)

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President. This was a corrected measure also that was brought to our attention. And really all it is doing is taking out of the rules the order in which it would be brought up. If there's any discussion that's fine with us. We request it's adoption.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the rule change? Question is shall that rule change be adopted? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Voting on the second rules change as explained by Senator Duis. Perhaps the chair should again remind you that it takes 30 votes to change the rules. Voting on rules change #2 as explained by Senator Duis. Found on page 119. Well it's only a rules change and I suppose the chair shouldn't be in a position to lobbying for votes here, but I would remind the body that it takes 30 votes to change the rules. Thank you.
