

SENATOR DUIS: The point that I am getting at Senator Luedtke is that we are taking a drivers license for leaving even a.. a..parking violation whereas a drivers license is generally only taken away for only a serious offense.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Your not. May I answer that. You are not taking a drivers license away. You are depositing it as securiry for appearance only and the receipt is your license.

SENATOR DUIS: Most all insurance policies and everything else has bonding privileges within them.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yeah, but you are not taking away no license has been taken away by this bill.

SENATOR DUIS: Well I guarantee you that if that policeman or that judge has got my license it is gone.

SEANTOR LUEDTKE: It is not unless your license has been suspended by the court it is not gone.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the bill? Senator Whitney then Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, Senator Luedtke would you answer a question for me? Is there a provision in the bill that the license will be given back to the offender?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yes.

SENATOR WHITNEY: There is that provision?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: That was made quite specific by the amend-ment which we adopted.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Will Senator Luedtke yield to a question?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yes.

SENATOR DICKINSON: You were talking amendments about exclusions, would you please explain this again briefly?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yes, if you would go to page 2 you will see along about line 17 section one, when the charge is for driving while under the influence etc. etc., and there is a number of them. The officer may retain the drivers license depending or rather pending investigation and shall return the same or issue a receipt whichever...now this shows the kind of cases under which this kind of thing can be held. Now included was willful wreckless driving and wreckless driving which upon closer xruitny by the committee we do not feel was in the same category as those other offenses. But at the very beginning in line one and two it seems to say that any person arrested and.....

SENATOR DICKINSON: AT the very beginning in line two it seems to say that any person arrested and charged with violating a traffic law of the state and then the ordinance and the or a local authority or so forth...this would seem to include every-thing in any minor offense that we might be talking about such as parking or backing out across the street the wrong way in a small town and this would seem to me to be very cumbersome and inconvenience for those people who haven't comitted a very serious crime.

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
