for a week, that is the motion and that is what we are going to speak too. Senator Duis do you wish to speak to the motion to bracket it.

SENATOR DUIS: I think that I need to speak to the motion because I think Senator DeCamp would like to correct the statement, at least I want an explanation of the statement that he made because I realize that we are in public view here and I believe that you said that the policeman who stopped you at 11:00 at night could ask you for a hundred dollar bond. Now I hope that you didn't say that because I hope that that is not the case. I hope that the arresting officer can not set bond. Now, it is my understanding that if he arrests you at 11:00 at night he has got to do one of two things. He either has to take you in there or tell you to appear at a certain time but he can not set the bond. The judge can set the bond.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Senator Duis as a practical matter the judges pretty regularly would follow the recommendations of an arresting officer.

SENATOR DUIS: I'm not saying that.

SENATOR DE CAMP: If he said a hundred dollars I feel very likely that it would be that.

SENATOR DUIS: I think that you made the statement that you made is that if you were arrested at night and the officer set the bond at a hundred dollars and you didn't have the hundred dollars to give to the officer now that I don't....

SENATOR DE CAMP: That is not correct. I met or I meant that the officer is undoubtedly going to have an idea as to what he feels the bond should be. Particularly a small town a marshall for some reason, they have an inclination to set rather high bonds for rather minimal offenses, and this would eliminate this particular type of a problem.

SENATOR DUIS: I just wanted to be sure that we were correct in this sort of thing.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp was asking unanimous consent to bracket the bill for a week. Are there objections to bracketing 520 for a week? Senator Nore objects, very good then. Senator DeCamp do you make a motion then that we bracket?

SENATOR DE CAMP: I'll move to do it, all that I am asking is that you just contact your own judge or county attorney, have
