SENATOR RICHENDIFER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, to show Senator Carpenter that I am not as stubborn as Senator Luedtke, I would ask unanimous consent to withdraw my amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Richendifer is asking unanimous consent to withdraw his amendments, are there objections to the withdrawal to that amendment? Hearing none, so ordered, withdrawn. Senator Luedtke, back to you then for the committee amendments, are there any further discussion of the committee amendments? Senator DeCamp, your light is still on, do you want to discuss the committee amendments?

CLERK: Motion on the desk, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Just a minute, we are discussing the committee amendments, Senator DeCamp? Alright, Senator Fred Carstens, your light is still on, did you want to be recognized to speak on the committee amendments to this bill. We are speaking on the committee amendments now, the Richendifer amendment has been withdrawn.

SENATOR FRED CARSTENS: I am sorry, I don't know what the committee amendments are now, I am trying to, I will waive mine for the time being.

PRESIDENT: Alright thank you. Senator Luedtke, we are back to you then on the committee amendments.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Is Senator Carpenter going to put on the motion, he has been busy, I wonder if he realizes that we are back to the original.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter, we are back to the committee amendments now, the Richendifer amendment has been withdrawn.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move to reduce the amount from a thousand to five hundred dollars.

PRESIDENT: The motion now before us is to amend the committee amendments to a thousand to five hundred. That is the amendment that we will now debate. Senator Carpenter?

SENATOR CARPENTER: I have nothing to say or any closing.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion of the Carpenter amendment which would reduce the amount now of the committee amendments from a thousand to five hundred dollars? Alright, all those in favor of the Carpenter amendment vote aye, all those opposed vote no. The motion is to change the amount of the check now from a thousand to five hundred, and that is the Carpenter amendment to the committee amendments to LB568. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 10 nays.

PRESIDENT: Very good, now the amendment is adopted and now we have the committee amendments as amended, back to Senator Luedtke then.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I would move that LB568 be advanced to E & R initial as amended. Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this particular bill
