So this is information that I am sure you will want to rely on throughout the session and there will be other information coming along. We have asked for a continuation of this and some places in more detail. If you have further questions about this, please feel free to come to either Senator Marvel or myself or other members of the Revenue and Budget committee who have been briefed on what is in this document and otherwise that is all I have to say at this time because I believe that the figures are self explanatory and is very well documented.
