PRESIDENT: Next to speak was Senator Proud then Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR PROUD: Mr. President, I didn't understand why Senator Goodrich wanted to bracket this. Senator Goodrich would you tell me the reason.

SENATOR GOODRICH: As you all know the bill 217 was taken up the first full day we were here. It is rather obvious that the preparation for a bill like this was not done when it was pushed through. The representation that was made on the floor relative to the bill were not in some cases the right story relative to the bill and it is for that reason that I would suggest that we would slow down, hold our horses for a little bit and get a chance to properly consider the bill with whatever amendment might want to be coming onto the bill in order to make it a bill that we can live with. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: In order to eliminate part of the debate I have a motion on the Clerk's desk that I wish that you would read and then we will consider it when we get to general file.

CLERK: You mean the motion on LR19 Senator? Well that has been indefinitely postponed, but we are on 217.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I understand. Senator Stahmer indicated that he wanted to wait until something was done to LR19. I want to indicate to him that something I hope will be done and to indefinitely postpone it. I'll make that motion when it gets on General File.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh did you wish to be heard on the motion here to bracket LB217? Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I don't see any reason to tie the two issues together. I don't appreciate Senator Goodrich's comments that the bill was not well prepared, and has not had adequate time. It was in here last year, we all considered it last year and we all knew what it was. I certainly don't appreciate his comments that there was misrepresentation as to the bill on the floor. The only misrepresentations that I heard were in his comments and I don't think that we can bracket the bill until he corrects his comments so I would urge that we pass it along.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney, the motion is to bracket 217 on Select File for a week.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President I look at this as Senator Chambers and Senator Cavanaugh and I support them. That this would just be a delaying tactic in which which we are going to face this bill and we have been debating the bill since 1969. You can bring in all the amendments that you want, but the only amendments that will come in now are to hamper, to weigh it down so that the bill in its pure form as it is now will find itself so that it will be unpalatable to Senators in this particular chamber, and this is the story what happened to me in 1969. When it got over to final reading they began to put on amendments that various Senators in here could no longer vote for it. As it first started out it was a good bill. So if we delay it another week we are in trouble. I end this by saying that the testimony on the first

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
