PRESIDENT: Senator Syas. We had yesterday of course, unfinished business relating to LB104. Are you ready to take it up this morning. We are ready for it then now, and you can go from there.

CLERK: Read LB104

PRESIDENT: Who wants to be heard first here on the Stahmer Amendment. Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, members of the body. Senator Whitney recommended a slightly different wording phraseology that he felt was superior English, should convey a better meaning. And I would like to have the Clerk read that. It should be right attached to it and it's just a slight change in the English and if you'd like unanimous consent to change that.

PRESIDENT: Will the Clerk read the substituted language for the Stahmer Amendment.

SENATOR STAHMER: It should be underneath there or on top of it.

CLERK: I have another one signed by you.

SENATOR STAHMER: Right. It was slightly different wording in it.

CLERK: It says..there's no page or line or anything. And it is not a part of an urban area. It has nothing to do with Senator Whitney. Page 4, line 4 after "conditions" add "and is not a part of an Urban Area".

PRESIDENT: Let's see if we can get unanimous consent to substitute that language for the original Stahmer Amendment. Are there any objections to Senator Stahmer substituting that amendment. And any objections to his withdrawal of his first amendment and then substituting this. Are there any objections? Hearing none. So ordered then. This is the amendment before the body. Does anybody want to be heard on the Stahmer Amendment LB104. Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Well I'm not going to be a..I'll check with the Attorney General on this after you put it on. I don't really object to it. The only thing about it is. I think the law always says the Attorney General writes these things rather than the Legislature of the title how they are presented to the ballot. But for the time being I can check it if it's wrong. If it does prove to be wrong I can catch it on Select File.

PRESIDENT: All right. Now any further discussion then of the Stahmer Amendment to LB104. Now let's see if we can do it by voice vote. All those in favor to the Stahmer Amendment then say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered then the Stahmer Amendment is adopted.

CLERK: There are no further amendments to the bill.

PRESIDENT: All right, we're back to the bill as amended. Senator Dickinson.
