PRESIDENT: All right, the question is should the Waldron amendment to LB128 be adopted. All those in favor will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. We're voting on the adoption of the Waldron amendment to LB128. Voting on the Waldron Amendment to LB 128. The one which would require fingerprints. Have you all voted? Once again, have you all voted? Clerk will record.

PRESIDENT: Senator Waldron asking for a call of the house. Clear the board. The next bell please indicate your preference on the Call of the House. All those in favor of the Call of the House vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Motion is for call of the house. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes 16 nays.

PRESIDENT: We're now under a Call of the House. Next bell please indicate your presence. Motion before the body and it's under vote is the Waldron amendment to LB 128 which would require fingerprints on the drivers license. Senator Clark for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CLARK: I would ask for the Call be raised. There was 40 votes on the board. There's only 43 people here. You need 6 votes and there is only 3. I'd ask the Call be Raised.

PRESIDENT: Clear the board. Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Senator Burbach voting no on your original motion.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to raise the call. Clear the board please. Motion is to Raise the Call. All those in favor of Raising the Call vote aye, those opposed vote no. Thank you. The clerk will record. 35 ayes to Raise

CLERK: 35 ayes to Raise the Call.

PRESIDENT: Call is Raised. Read the call on the original vote.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 22 nays.

PRESIDENT: The motion is lost. We're back to the original bill 128.

CLERK: Mr. President motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion on the desk.

CLERK: I move to indefinitely postpone LB 128 (Signed) Senator Rasmussen.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, members of the body. I don't think there is any small piece of paper that has been kicked around any more on this floor than our drivers licenses. I'm going to agree with Senator Chambers. This is issued for driving, and in my opinion nothing else. We had a bill set back indefinitely on General File today that we could leave and take a scrap of paper for a license, put a fingerprint on it. I feel that if the merchants are so concerned they can bring out their own identification. Or possibly take only Mastercharge or other credit cards which are certainly available. I would that we indefinitely postpone it.
