

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, in answer to Senator Whitney I didn't understand the letter as he did that they were to accompany me, that didn't mean that they were going to sit with me. They were going to be around I presume and I think that they could use my office and the other places that is necessary and I would be in hopes that I could get the information that is necessary. I just wanted to make the one correction if I might in regards to the rules then as to the president and also to the speaker it says. It says the "Chair" and that would mean anybody that is in the Chair at that particular time would be the one that would grant the permission. It would not necessarily be confined to the Speaker or to the President, but the person in the Chair. That is what the rule says.

PRESIDENT: Thank you Senator Duis. Speaker Proud.

SPEAKER: I might just say in regards to the Junior Chamber of Commerce. I don't know who made all the arrangements for this, they were not made through me, but I would have to understand them to mean that these gentlemen would be available here and perhaps could be in your offices if one of them is assigned to you but, they will not as Senator Carpenter indicated be permitted to sit beside the particular legislator during our session and I did receive a letter from their president a Mr. Geisler or something similar to that who asked permission to address the legislature for I believe 15 minutes and I refused that permission, I didn't like too, but the fact of the matter is that we get numerous requests from people who want to address this legislature and we are we meet for such a short time in these annual sessions that I feel to grant any of these requests would be out of order. There are some exceptions like the ceremony we had for the late Dr. Nelhardt but other than that, I feel that we can not grant permission for associations to address the legislature and I hope that you are agreeable with that.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, members a...a...

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the motion? Any further discussion of Senator Carpenter's motion? Question is then shall the motion be adopted that would ask the Chair to enforce the rule of regarding floor privileges. Motion is to ask the Chair to enforce the rule regarding the floor privileges and as it relates to people seated besides the Senators. Chair would again ask if you have all voted? Clerk will record.
