SENATOR DUIS: I think that you heard Senator Carpenter and I discussing and a I would be very happy to visit with Senator Carpenter and have an amendment prepared that we or that would satisfy him.

PRESIDENT: Thank you because I think that it is now that the motion could be complicated enough and I'm not sure that the Chair could follow that.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, I move that or ask unanimous consent that we have this matter laid over until tomorrow, and Senator Duis and I and any other Senators or Senator who desire to participate in this kind of a motion contact us and I'm sure we would like to have your judgment in the matter.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter is now asking unanimous consent to lay this motion over until tomorrow and that anyone that might have input or interest contact Senator Carpenter regarding the motion. Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: I just want to ask Senator Carpenter a question. I'm not opposing him laying it over.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Carpenter will you yield for a question?

SENATOR SYAS: Do you think in the meantime and I will let you make the decision on this because you know that I have the two bills that the Secretary of State and the Attorney General have agreed upon. It kind of puts me in a bind as to whether or not I should introduce them. Were you thinking about calling the Attorney and the Secretary of State in here to the Legislature or in the meantime or were you just laying this over. I'm just bringing up the question.

SENATOR CARPENTER: No, but I would suggest to the Senator and it is only a suggestion. Introduce the bills, and set the hearing within five days and lets find out what happens in the meantime. I wouldn't hold your bills up at all.

SENATOR SYAS: Well they are not my bills really, I'm.... Since the fact that I am the Chairman, they were given to me lets put it that way. I didn't ask for them.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Whose bills are they and who are they going to be introduced by?
