It is the chair's understanding that it substitutes for the resolution. Any further discussion of that? Do you want time to read it? Are you ready for the question? All right, the question is, shall the amendment be adopted to Legislative Resolution 19. All those in favor, vote aye. All those opposed, vote no. Voting on the Carpenter Amendment to LR19. Have you all voted? Voting on the Carpenter Amendment to LR19.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I don't want to prolong the subject.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter is asking for a record vote. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Voting aye Senator Burbach, Carpenter, C. Carsten, F. Carstens, Clark, Dickinson, Epke, Goodrich, Hasebroock, Johnson, Kennedy, Mahoney, Maresh, Marvel, Moylan, Murphy, Nore, Proud, Rasmussen, Schmit, Snyder, Stromer, Syas, Waldron, Whitney and Wiltse. Voting nay, Senator Stahmer. Not voting Senators Anderson, Barnett, Cavanaugh, Chambers, DeCamp, Duis, Fellman, Fowler, Kelly, Keyes, Kime, Kremer, F. Lewis, R. Lewis, Luedtke, Marsh, Richendifer, Savage, Simpson, Skarda, Stull and Warner. 26 ayes, 1 nay, 22 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. The motion passes. Now, are there any other amendments on the desk? Are there motions on the desk?

CLERK: Yes. I have a series of them, Mr. President. Thank you. The first one we received, Mr. President, is a motion by Senator Stahmer. (Read motion).

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, and members of the Body. I want to ask Senator Chambers a question if I might.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, will you yield to a question? From Senator Stahmer?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That motion was left on the desk some days ago. That's the motion that I'm talking about...it's indefinitely postponed, LR19.

SENATOR STAHMER: Senator Chambers, do you have a similiar motion?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Not similiar, I have that motion and it precedes yours by a number of days.

SENATOR STAHMER: Well, whether it did or didn't, I'm willing to withdraw mine in favor of yours. Would you like that? All right, withdraw my motion in favor of Senator Chamber's motion.

PRESIDENT: Well, there's still one more ahead of that.

PRESIDENT: Wait a minute. Are there objections to withdrawing Senator Stahmer's motion. Any objections? Senator Carpenter objects. You'll have to make a motion then, Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: I move we substitute the Stahmer motion for the Chamber motion to kill the bill.

PRESIDENT: No, wait...didn't you mean it the other way? You moved to substitute the Chambers...well....

SENATOR STAHMER: I so move.

PRESIDENT: The motion before us says to substitute the Chambers motion now for the Stahmer motion. Can't really do that. The motion is to withdraw his bill and your motion will have to be to withdraw your bill and there were objections to it. You couldn't do it by unanimous consent, now you'll have to do it by vote because it's the property of the Legislature. It'll have to be removed that way.

SENATOR STAHMER: I don't care if we mickey mouse around. The whole thing's mickey mouse. I moved to be allowed to withdraw my kill motion.
