who may wish to ask for their meters to be checked. Otherwise the Department of Agriculture has no authority to check those meters. I move to return LB 17 for that specific amendment and I will enlarge on that discussion then.'

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion of that motion. Question is shall LB 17 be returned for Select File for specific amendment, all those in favor of returning the bill vote aye, those opposed vote no. The motion is to return the bill. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, Mr. President on a motion to return.

PRESIDENT: The bill is returned. Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Well, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. The other day I did have an amendment for LB 17, and it done about what this particular one did now other than that was not broad enough to have the Department of Agriculture go to the pumps and meters and measuring devices of state property, cities and counties if they have any, but this would give them the permission to write any such exempt weighing and measuring device may be inspected or tested by the inspector upon request of the person owning such device. Now this broadens it in that area where it was excluded before. And I move for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the amendment. Senator Marvel did you want to be heard on the amendment. Senator Carpenter did you want to be heard on the amendment. Question shall the amendment explained by Senator Burbach to LB 17 on Select File be adopted. All those in favor will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. You are voting for the adoption of the specific amendment to LB 17 on Select File. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes Mr. President on a motion to adopt.

PRESIDENT: The motion is adopted. Senator Burbach what's your pleasure.

SENATOR BURBACH: I move to advance LB 17 to E & R For Engrossment.

PRESIDENT: The motion now is to readvance LB 17 as amended. All those in favor of advancing the bill please say aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered. The bill as amended is advanced. Senator Marvel for what purpose do you rise.

SENATOR MARVEL: I have an announcement about activities for tomorrow. Any Legislature who is interested in going to Des Moines, who has not indicated that interest it is suggested that he talk to Mr. Ehrlich in the fiscal office.
