SENATOR PROUD: Mr. President, there were 3 proxy votes on that vote. Where does that put it? I saw 3 fellows pushing other buttons. No, that's not true. (LAUGHTER)

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Barnett. For what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR BARNETT: Well, Mr. President, you congratulated me. I want to know what for? I want to know what you congratulated me for, I think that's the sixth time you've beat me on a challenge of the Chair and I don't think that calls for congratulations.

PRESIDENT: Senator Skarda.

SENATOR SKARDA: Mr. President, excuse me for a minute. I've got to go to the bathroom. (LAUGHTER)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature.

PRESIDENT: I'm sorry for confusing you, Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: That's okay.

PRESIDENT: That was somewhat complicated.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Natural state. In view of the fact that this bill was dead for two weeks has like a Messiah been given life. Why don't we get the issue resolved rather quickly here. I have the final statistics which I promised this Body I would get to them which I think will resolve it very quickly and so I would ask unanimous consent to take the issue up immediately.
