SENATOR BURBACH: In the last several days, probably the day before yesterday, Senator Thome Johnson and I handed out tickets to the membership of this Body to entitle them to join the Fair Managers for a dinner and an evening of entertainment by special talent, troupes, etc. And, also on that same evening many of us or probably most of us have responded to the Tri-City Area group which are having a social hour and a dinner that same evening. Yesterday I visited with both groups, Fair Managers and with the Tri-City people and it was decided that on Tuesday evening, the 22nd, the Tri-City people who are hosting the Legislature in the Nebraska Club will have their dinner, their social hour and the dinner, and try to be completed by 8:30. The Fair Managers Association will have their dinner and will stretch lateness some until approximately 8:30. And then all those who have attended the other function will have the opportunity to come over to the Cornhusker Hotel and view and see and partake in the program with...the Fair Managers have set up there. Now, I think there's a tally sheet being circulated at this time, if not, I hope there will be one real soon to tell the people from the people from the Tri-City Area how many people intend to go to their function. And, then, by the same token, those of you who do go there and have received these tickets, would you bring them back to Senator Johnson or myself if you're not going to be using them and we will return them to the Fair Managers so they will not be charged for them. I think that the confusion arose because the calendar probably did not show that the Fair Managers were going to have their session on Tuesday evening. And, the Tri-City people did call in for an open date and the date up here had opened. But, in the bylaws of the Fair Managers of the State Fair Association, there must be a meeting the 4th week of January. Statutorily, they have their meeting then at that time and for years, the 4th week...Tuesday of the year has been the banquet night. I think that will clear up the issue and we can attend both functions if we so desire.

SENATOR STROMER: This is in relation to the same thing that Senator Burbach was speaking of and we have, by moving the Tri-City dinner to 6:00 were able to make it possible for people to have dinner with the Tri-City Chamber and then also still attend the Fair Board meeting. I think this will make it possible for both of them to be held without having to cancel one or the other since as on many of these there is a great deal of planning and other people coming in. So, it's difficult to do this. Now, the tally sheet that Senator Burbach was mentioning, this was to merely reconfirm those replies that you had already sent on the... for the Tri-City Chamber meeting and meeting on the evening of the 22nd. I think Senator Kelly will be getting that passed around for response.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly, did you want to be reached? Recognized?

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, a point of personal privilege for an advertising tag. This is the first time that the people from Central Nebraska and the Golden Triangle of the Tri-Cities has come down to have dinner with their Legislators. I wish you would in all graciousness do your best to cooperate with those people in Central Nebraska. They're going to be here pretty close to 100 strong and they sure do want to see you.
