I want to be sure and be there because I want to see what relationship it has to LB 50 because I still think we had a good bill. As a committee bill, you see our committee is the one that introduced yet we know nothing about, of course I'm the one, a little wondering why the introducers of this particular measure didn't come to the rules and regulations and check with us to whether or not what we wanted to this. I'm wondering if we couldn't combine them but why don't you go ahead and get the bill introduced, and have the hearing and then we'll know. Thank you so much, I appreciate it.

SENATOR KREMER: Well Senator Duis, only this comment. Sometimes we all make mistakes, and perhaps we should have and perhaps we owe you an apology if you want it.

SENATOR DUIS: No, no, I was just concerned, someone has asked you to introduce it I presume, and I don't know who. But if it were some individual or organization ask for the introduction of the bill or was it the thought of your committee.

SENATOR KREMER: We discussed LB 50 very briefly, as we talked about the bills that were carried over. And this one, yes, came from within the committee, perhaps it is the time to look at the whole system, of state agencies and see what could be done, not only LB 50.

SENATOR DUIS: Well, that's fine then, I thank you for the information, I appreciate it.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion of Senator Kremer's motion to introduce the bill? All right, the Clerk want to read the title

CLERK; The first one is, I move the introduction of the attached bill, a bill for the enactment of change the name of the drivers license abstract and computerization fund.

PRESIDENT: The question is should the bill be introduced. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. This is on the first bill only. The question is should the bill, the first bill relating to the drivers license be introduced. Under the rules of the Legislature, it does require 30 votes. Thank you. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is introduced.

CLERK: I move for the introduction of Advanced Bill request 1287, (read)

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer, do you want to make any remarks regarding bill #2.

SENATOR KREMER: Only this Mr. Chairman, this bill is a result of an inner study. The study of setting up a natural resources fund, a fund to promote natural resources in the State of Nebraska, the question to a sub-committee of the two committees, and this is a result of their recommendation. This sub-committee was headed by Senator Loran Schmit, and perhaps he would like to make a public statement about it.
