

PRESIDENT: 569, correct. Attention please the final reading of LB569. The Assistant Clerk will read the bill.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Read LB569

PRESIDENT: While provision of law relative to procedure having been complied with the question is shall the bill pass. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Once again have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Voting aye, Senators Anderson, Barnett, Burbach, Carpenter, Carsten, Cavanaugh, Chambers, Clark, DeCamp, Duis, Epke, Fellman, Fowler, Goodrich, Hasebroock, Johnson, Kennedy, Keyes, Kime, Kremer, Luedtke, Mahoney, Maresh, Marsh, Marvel, Moylan, Proud, Rasmussen, Savage, Schmit, Skarda, Snyder, Stahmer, STromer, Stull, Waldron, Warner, Whitney and Wiltse. Voting nay Senators Kelly, R. Lewis and More. Not voting Senators F. Carstens, Dickinson, F. Lewis, MURphy, Richendifer, Simpson and Syas. 39 ayes, 3 nays and 7 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is passed. Are there any resolutions on the desk?

CLERK: Read LR105

PRESIDENT: Senator Marvel what is your pleasure regarding this resolution?

SENATOR MARVEL: Well the motion would be to suspend the rules and take up the resolution at this time. You have already read the resolution? I am speaking on the motion to suspend the rules and take up the resolution. I think that the resolution itself is self explanatory and about Fred Seaton's contribution to the nation and to Nebraska and the fact that he was the one who encouraged me first to run for the Unicameral makes it even more personal as far as I am concerned and would ordinarily be true and therefore I would hope that we could at this time in memory of one of the most distinguished citizens of the state of Nebraska vote unanimously to suspend the rules and then stand for a moment in silence in respect to him and his contributions. One other point that I would like to make and that is that the funeral will be held at Hastings at 10:00 Monday morning. So I renew my motion to suspend the rules, take up the resolution and then stand for a moment of respect to a very dedicated public servant.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I just one to make one further statement. He inadvertently was the creation of Joe Smith.

PRESIDENT: Question is shall the rules be suspended and the resolution taken up at this time. All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. This is to take up the resolution only. Excuse me this is to suspend the rules only. Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 44 ayes Mr. President.
