Dorothy Chambers, who is the Attorney for the Nebraska State Education Association, Juil Fergeson, Attorney representing Class 3 school districts in western Nebraska, Jerry Cook, the Attorney for the Omaha Suburban Area Council of Schools, and Vern Moore, Attorney representing Class 3 School, Omaha area. Allen J. Burmer, the Secretary of State and his Deputy, Ralph Englers. Now as I say this is a clarification and establishment of what they think is necessary. I would suggest two things, we adopt the amendments, we move the bill over to Select File. We let it rest there so the membership of this body will have plenty time to look at them and to understand them better than they now do. I don't think that they are particularly important. But some of the members in the field or..interest in education they may be. So I would suggest that we adopt the amendments which we printed in the Journal. And move the bill to Select File. If you want to get it back to General File for any reason after you look at it, read it and discuss, you certainly will have no opposition from me to return it to General File for consideration on there rather than Select File. Now Mr. President I make the motion that we adopt the amendments.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion of the amendments. The question is then, shall the amendments be adopted. Those in favor please say aye, those opposed say no. The ayes have it. The amendments are adopted.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move the bill as amended, be moved to E & R Initial, with the understanding when it gets on Select File, if any member desires to move it back to General File at least he will have no objection from the introducer of the amendments. I suggest that you look at them. I don't think that they are really important, but they may be, I'm not a student on education at least this kind of education. So I move the question.

PRESIDENT: Now, Senator Carpenter, Senator Carpenter so that we don't confuse things here, and the chair understands that first off, I thought I understood at least that we were discussing those amendments that are here on 238 and 239. And as far as the chair is concerned we have adopted those amendments. Now the chair understands that there is also on the desk another series of amendments, of which are not printed and are not there, and I think we need a separate, either of explanation or separate motion regarding those amendments, because they were separate files, those that were printed in the Journal.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Those amendments that were printed in the Journal, I understood, for example were not all printed in the Journal.

PRESIDENT: That's the chairs understanding too.

SENATOR CARPENTER: For no reason, except it was an error on the part of those have the printing of the Journal thought inclusive. And I want to bring to the body's attention that we ought to adopt all the amendments on the various pages pertaining -to this subject. And because that's the amendments that we are considering.

PRESIDENT: Senator Proud, we have a reading under discussion before the body another set of amendments here which were inadvertently left out of the printing process and did not appear. All right, then through some..to clarify things to make it clear the amendments apparently did not arrive in the
