SENATOR SYAS: I move that that be adopted. Senator Rasmussen was worried about the cattle drinking in that sort of thing which is minor. This defines that the income on any land would be defined by the Legislature. In other words you fellows and ladies will do it, so I hope you trust yourself and so that type of little thing wouldn't happen. I move for it's adoption.

SPEAKER: Now you have heard the question. Is there any further discussion, Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Syas. I would assume that kind of amendment would also make it permissible for the Legislature to take in to account this appreciated income. The value that was added to land over a period of time.

SENATOR SYAS: Well I would say. The Attorney General told me, I didn't ask him this specific question, Senator Warner. But the only thing I asked him was that some members of the Senate were worried about what would be denoted as income, well, we'll just put in their, "income" will be defined by the Legislature. Which he says leaves a lot of leah way to do a lot of things.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion. Are you ready for the question? The question is shall the amendment be adopted. It requires 25 votes. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no, This requires 25 votes. This is an amendment to Senator Syas bill. Have you all voted? I'm holding this open for all, because I presume he will have this open for the house if he doesn't have 25 votes. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The amendment is adopted. The clerk will read Senator Syas second amendment.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President there are two more amendments that are pending in the Journal. They are found on page 313, offered by Senator Syas. On page 313 of the Journal.

SPEAKER: Senator are you ready to explain. Let's take them one at a time. Explaining your next one.

CLERK: The next one would be standing committee amendment line 4 by inserting after "areas" the following, "not otherwise exempt".

SENATOR SYAS: This amendment the Attorney General suggested because there are certain things now exempted on it at the present constitution and statutes and we would want to retain this, which we did in the original, but this clarifies this so there will be no flack from it that we didn't do it.

SPEAKER: Do you have any further discussion of that? Senator Kime. Somebody give Senator page 313. Senator Cavanaugh, were you asking for the floor. Any further discussion Ready for the question. The question is shall this amendment be adopted? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. This requires 25 votes again. Let me ask you Senator Syas, if you don't get the 25 votes are you going to have a call of the house. I don't want to be accused of holding the board open for anybody. I'll hold it open a little bit then. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.
