SENATOR WHITNEY: I would just like to ask unanimous consent to take that up at this time.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Whitney is asking unanimous consent to take up LB 432A at this time. The chair is wondering if there objection to considering 432A at this time. If there are please object now? Hearing none. So ordered. Then I'll move for the General File consideration for LB 432A.

CLERK: LB 432A (read)

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Simpson. Excuse me, Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President and members of the Legislature This bill is completely explained. It just simply to take care of the expenses for this particular project and I move the bill to E & R Initial

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion to the motion? The question then is shall LB 432A be advanced from General File to E & R Initial. All those in favor will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. The motion is to advance LB 432A from General File. Have you all voted. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. That brings for General File debate then LB 568.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB568 was first considered on January 4 the title was read at that time. Committee amendments were considered and adopted. There is pending apparently an amendment by Senator Goodrich. There is an amendment by Senator Murphy. Senator Carpenter offered an amendment which was adopted. Senator DeCamp offered a motion to kill, which was adopted

PRESIDENT: And the amendments are pending. Did you say the Goodrich amendment.

CLERK: I think from Senator Murphy and Senator Goodrich, yes.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich in the chamber? What do you want to do about your amendment here to 568?

CLERK: Then I have one from Senator Murphy also to amend. No person who issues counterfeit money in an amount less than \$1,000. shall be charged as a felon.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy are you ready on your amendment here to 568.

SENATOR MURPHY: I am I would ask a question to the Chair. At the last discussion of this bill it was decided that an uneven vote had been negated and we therefore had a tie, and I raised the issue of whether or not the Lt. Governor shall or may vote to resolve that tie. And I believe that was taken under consideration by the chair. And I think it would be proper at this time for the chair to vote, or to rule.
