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part that he is not learned to what the situation is. For the first time Bill Skarda is going to make a request in this body. And I am earnest, and I do hope that you support the introduction of this bill. There may be some parts of it that some of don't agree with. But the time the bill is heard maybe we can make some corrective change. So as I stand before you this morning, I in all interest plead with you to give your sincere consideration for introduction. At that time Senator Dickinson can be objectionable if he wishes. At the public hearing.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney. For what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR MAHONEY: To speak in behalf of this. Senator Dickinson this is just the introduction of the bill. We are not deciding it here. The word direct could be taken out of there. We could say may, work with. Could meet together. We don't have to use that word 'direct'. And Senator Dickinson you are in this district. The only problem I suppose is that you don't have the property, or actually you don't have that many students in your particular area. We are talking about down in the area where these kids come for the penal colonies. We are talking about giving them a change instead of going to higher education to have the opportunity, Senator Dickinson, to work per hand. This might save the state some money, Senator Dickinson. This might give them the opportunity to lead. To learn. 14 or 15 different crafts, so you wouldn't have to put them in Lincoln at the reformatory. This is something that we would like for 100 years in this state, Senator Dickinson.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dickinson, would you care to respond?

SENATOR DICKINSON: Will Senator Mahoney yield to a question? I must have missed one of his statements, if you say I'm not in this area?

SENATOR MAHONEY: No Senator Dickinson, I say you are definitely are in it. Every boundary has got you in this. Your city of Millard is in here. Which is part of Omaha now.

SENATOR DICKINSON: This body has a hard time making up it's mind in what it wants to do in the area of community colleges and it's about time we let something stand and let it have time to develop.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Possibly I could answer that for you, Senator Jim Dickinson by saying that nothing is pure and good when it first comes out. You have to kick these things around. And sometimes when you look around you have to go to the very core where the problems at. We've got the problem in this whole area of Douglas County. We can't send everything out to Clearview Home. We've got to put something down where the students are at.

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. President, I'd like to ask Senator Warner a question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner will you yield to a question?
