PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, Senator Carpenter, I tell you I will find out immediately what it is. But I can tell you this, that it is enacted upon by the Department of Motor Vehicles under their suggestion, whether it is a rule or regulation or State Statute, I'll find immediately.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Thank you, I'll convey that to my wife. But I hope you get back before I leave.

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes, for what purpose do you want to be recognized.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. President, while we are on the subject of drivers licenses and points, and I think the insurance companies are involved in this. Is there anybody on the floor of this Legislature that can tell me if the insurance companies are involved in this point system because my son-in-law lost some points on his drivers license and he got put on a high risk which cost him in the vicinity of \$600 to have insurance and he had not been in the group that had had accidents that caused damage. So he was in there for 2 years, and I wonder of the insurance companies are sitting down and writing these laws or if we write them for the good of the people of this state.

PRESIDENT: Motion before the house is the introduction of request #1421 as explained by Senator Kremer. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I've done a bit of talking to various members on the floor and I certainly did not want to be discourteous to Senator Kremer about my asking that you reject his motion to suspend the rules because out of courtesy we do this, but I can see that this bill is not going to meet a very favorable fate in whatever committee it goes to. It is a poor bill and I can state what I think the motives behind it are. But I won't go into that. I'm going to suggest that we do not suspend the rules this morning, we do not introduced this bill. And we can handle right now, or prevent from happening this morning in a short space of time, which will take much of our time later on. So I ask that you vote not to suspend the rules, and allow this bill to be introduced this morning.

PRESIDENT: Speaker Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: I'd like to ask, who is asking for the introduction?

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer, do you care to respond.

SENATOR KREMER: Department of Motor Vehicles.

SENATOR PROUD: I didn't hear that.

SENATOR KREMER: Department of Motor Vehicles.

SENATOR PROUD: Well, that is under the Governor, is it not?

SENATOR KREMER: I would suspect that it is.

SENATOR PROUD: Well, I wouldn't..somebody told me the Governor is asking for this bill.
