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shall not apply to committee bills, etc. But any additional signers shall be by the suspension of the rules with a machine vote, and cannot be made by unanimous consent. Beyond that, Mr. President, I think the common courtesy on which we guide ourselves in this democracy and society would indicate that it would be proper with a degree of protocol, I believe, that when a person has a bill he has introduced, that why should he be under the gun that he has to get the consent of the co-introducer who did not have the courage or the nicety to come to the introducer and say, "Would you mind if I went on the bill with you?"

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We can't carry on a dialog here now, Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: If Senator Snyder, if you will read page 23 with me, closely and carefully, I think the reference you have is after the three are on it, not prior to that time.

PRESIDENT: That's the way the Chair would rule.

SENATOR DUIS: So it's not more than three Senators. And then the suspension comes when there is more than three.

SENATOR SNYDER: I don't read it that way, Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Then we just have a difference in the way we read.

SENATOR SNYDER: Well then I would suggest that I'm not going to pursue it anymore. But I would suggest the Rules Committee review this section and clarify it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CARPENTER: In order to try to expedite and clarify. I would suggest and move that we continue this discussion when we meet again next week. In the meantime those who are in conflict of opinion can get together and see if they can reconcile their difference as to the rules. If they want to amend the rules, and they can get together with Senator Duis and permit a rule. Now the reason I do that is we must get some bills on General File, and this is one of those things that is important to those that are discussing. You can't solve it. Let's postpone it until we meet again next week, whatever that day is, and then we will have plenty of time.

PRESIDENT: Senator Syas. Excuse me. Senator Snyder do you want to withdraw your motion, then..I.

SENATOR SNYDER: A unified legislative, yes. I'll withdraw my motion.

PRESIDENT: With the understanding that you can bring it up again.

SENATOR SNYDER: Are we going to take this up. Let's set a date then..Monday morning when we come back?
