SENATOR SCHMIT: I agree with Senator Warner, I'm not going to take anymore time.

PRESIDENT: Senator Frank Lewis. Senator Frank Lewis passing. Senator Rasmussen. Stand by. Go ahead, Sir.

SENATOR FRANK LEWIS: Mr. Speaker, it's been very interesting, but if anybody here can tell me here how much we are going to get done on any given day, whether we've got a hundred bills on General File or one. I'd like to hear about it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney did you want to be heard on the issue?

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, I would think that Tuesday is too long, and I'm sure that the Legislature and these Committees can get together even this afternoon. I just think that those people that need to be excused tomorrow, should be excused and those of us that want to work on the 3 or 4 bills that we have and other things that we bring up normally, that we can continue with the Legislature as we are doing.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Maresh, then Kremer.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I would to report that the Labor Committee has acted on all five bills held by committee and I will go along with the majority.
