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that because there is no limitation of time from transferring an accredited school to a non-accredited school the action can be brought any time. Now what this bill would say is that you would have to bring the action within 4 years if you were in disagreement with that procedure. Now in my district in the city of Gering, eight years ago, with the permission of the school board, with the permission of the city council and other important people of my area the Lockwood Company which employs a thousand people were told that they were going to transfer this district into a non-accredited district. Which they did. Everyone was satisfied. This thing has gone along for 8 years. Now this would permit and would take would eliminate legal action in this particular case. And also prevent any legal action which occurred after 4 years after the transfer was made. The Lockwood Company employs a thousand people. They are one of the few main backbones of my community. And when all of these people collected as a record in the Department of Education to show without a question, when they give their word, legally, not legally, but technically and in the press and everywhere else, then I think the least we can do is to keep it. Now all this amendment does is germane. It just says that in the future no one can bring an action in any court after 4 years has expired from the time the transfer was made from a accredited into a non-accredited district. It also means that in my district, that the law suits now pending can't be made because of the 4 year limitation. And understanding that 8 years has elapsed. Now I don't want to be in the position not having explained to this body everything I have in mind. Because no Senator has no place here unless his word is trusted. Now you may or you may not accept my philosophy. But what I have told you is the truth. I move for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion of the amendment? The question is then, Shall the amendment as explained by Senator Carpenter be adopted to LB 592 on Select File. All those in favor of the motion will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. The motion before the house is the adoption of Senator Carpenter's amendment to 592 on Select File. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendments are adopted. Are there any further amendments.

CLERK: No further amendments.

PRESIDENT: Back to Senator Cavanaugh, then regarding the movement of LB 592. We have adopted all the amendments. Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I move that LB 592 as amended be advanced to E & R for Engrossing.

PRESIDENT: The motion now is to advance LB 592 as amended. All those in favor of advancing the bill please say aye, those opposed say no. The bill as amended is advanced.
