CLERK: Mr. President, we have a motion on the desk. I move that LB, I think that it would have to be a suspend of the rules. I move that we suspend the rules and place LB 986 and 987 on General File without a hearing. (Signed) Senator Marvel.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Marvel, for his motion. Is Senator Marvel in the chamber? Do we have other motions on the desk here. We will come back to that. Senator Clark do you want to handle it?

SENATOR CLARK: I move the motion be adopted. There is no particular reason for a hearing. We have already had the hearing.

PRESIDENT: The motion that you suspend the rules and place LB 986 and 987, which the Chair understands are both budget bills, directly on General File. That is the motion before the house. Senator Carpenter do you want to speak to the motion.

SENATOR CARPENTER: All I have to say is, this is not unusual. An ordinary procedure done. The Budget Committee has had their hearing. Obviously they are not expected to hold any further meetings or hearings. And it would be on here so we could make a determination of how we want to spend the money in the General Budget.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marvel, do you want to be heard on your motion there? To suspend the rules and place 986 and 987 on General File.

SENATOR MARVEL: Those two bills have to do with Legislative salaries, and the salaries of state officials. And in order to keep the show moving, since there is no debate on these bills, I'd like to have the motion to suspend the rules and put them on General File.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion now of the motion?
