SPEAKER: Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: This is the Governor's gift to the Legislature. I move the bill be advanced to..987 be advanced to E & R Initial. It simply pays our salaries.

SPEAKER: Motions on the desk on the bill?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: All those in favor of advancing this meditative measure vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, remainder not voting.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced. The next bill is LB 293 by Senator Simpson. Clerk will read the title.

CLERK: LB 293 (read) Mr. President, there are voluminous amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER: Are there any committee amendments?

CLERK: There are committee amendments, Mr. President, by Senator Luedtke's Judiciary Committee.

SPEAKER: Maybe we should take up those amendments first, should we not? Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: While on those amendments I move the adoption of those committee amendments to 293.

SPEAKER: All right. Senator Stull has moved the adoption of the committee amendments. Do you want to explain those Senator Stull? How many are there. Are there several?

CLERK: 3 pages. They appear in the Journal in full.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature. It is my understanding that these amendments were agreed to by interested parties on both sides, and I'll let Senator Simpson take those amendments.

SPEAKER: Senator Simpson do you wish to explain the committee amendments.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. Clerk will you announce again where these amendments are found in the Journal.

CLERK: The amendments are found in the Bill Book on the bill.

SPEAKER: Can you handle these amendments, Senator Simpson? We are on the committee amendments now.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. There are a lot of amendments. They have been brought about by a meeting when we first heard the bill. There was a lot of opposition. The committee asked since there were a lot of amendments from both sides that the people would get together, come back in with amendments and present them to the committee. This whole list of standing committee amendments were the result of that, between people in the industry and people representing the tenants. I can if some wishes go through and explain each amendment if necessary. There are 18 on this list and I would not do so, unless someone asks specifically on all or any of them.
