SENATOR SIMPSON: Jim Dunlavy told me that this would fall right in line with that.

SENATOR GOODRICH: O.K. then there is no objection whatsoever.

SPEAKER: All right since there is no objection to all of the Simpson amendments, except for amendment No. 1. It is so ordered. Now we come to the Simpson No. ...Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Now I would move to adopt No. 1, and as I explained Jim Dunlavy came to me and asked that we strike the "District Court" the section because appeals if you went directly to District Court would then again go to the same court, and this would not be proper, so I think that the "District Court" should be struck. You should use only the Municipal and the County Courts for the first two.

SPEAKER: All right, is there any further discussion of that amendment? Simpson amendment No. 1. If there is no discussion are you ready for the question? The question is: Shall the Simpson amendment No. 1 be adopted? All those in favor say aye. Those opposed say no. The amendment is adopted. Are there any further amendments, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Yes.

SPEAKER: Senator Goodrich. The Clerk has a whole stack of them..amendments and he has received these I presume in a certain order. Have you not, Mr. Clerk? I would also presume logically they should be taken up in the order they were presented. Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Except for one thing. I have tried to take in every objection to the bill. And if we could take up my amendments, I think you will find that there are several of those amendments pending that will no longer be necessary because they are included in the group of amendments that I have.

SPEAKER: Well, do you want to ask unanimous consent to take up your amendments first?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes.

SPEAKER: All right, Senator Goodrich is asking unanimous consent to take up his amendments first. Is there any objection to that? There is no objection. So ordered. Senator Goodrich. Now how many amendments do you have?

CLERK: Mr. President, most of them were just withdrawn. The amendment then..we have an amendment offered by Senator Mahoney on page 12, line 11, insert.", but this subsection shall not be applicable to housing authorities organized or existing under sections 71-1518 to 71-1554" after "appropriate".

SENATOR GOODRICH: Could I get the Clerk to explain what he just said.

SPEAKER: Mr. Clerk, Senator Goodrich didn't withdraw any of his amendments.

CLERK: No.
