If not, are you ready for the question? All those in favor of adopting the Mahoney Amendment say Aye, those opposed say no. The amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, are there further amendments?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: There are no further amendments. Back to you Senator Simpson, what do you do with the bill?

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, Senator Carpenter has asked that we now get all of the amendments adopted and incorporated into the bill. I would hope that we could have this done. Maybe we could hold the bill there for I don't know how long it would take, but I hope not too long, and then we might have a little more light on the bill and for consideration by the entire body. I would hope that this way we could have a constructive look at the bill and hopefully move it across then with no more major problems.

SPEAKER: Mr. Clerk, can you see that that is done?

CLERK: Yes sir.

SPEAKER: Now are there any objections to incorporating these amendments into the bill. I understand that this is the request. Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: The only thing that I would like to ask the Clerk is how long it would take them to get the bill into this form? It will take him four months, then we will set it for three days from now, how is that?

SPEAKER: I'm sure that with the assistance of Research Staff that that could be done. Could it not Mr. Clerk, within a week anyway?

CLERK: Clerk; yes, by next Monday.

PRESIDENT: By next Monday he says, is that agreeable Senator Simpson?

SENATOR SIMPSON: Then possibly next week we could take it up on Tuesday.

PRESIDENT: Yes. Lets go for that target date. The Clerk understands that Senator Simpson. We have not at this point bracketed it for Tuesday, but he will try and attempt to have it, to have it in form for Tuesday, is that agreeable? Alright, Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, I don't believe that these Goodrich Amendments or the Mahoney Amendments have been printed in the Journal have they? Could they not be printed?

PRESENT: They will now be printed.....is there any further discussion of the a...a..unanimous consent has been requested to pass this bill over right now and the Clerk will see that the amendments are incorporated into the bill and that you have these on your desk, then we will attempt to take these up next Tuesday.
