

PRESIDENT: Senator Whitney, we are still talking about Committee Amendments.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, will Senator Goodrich yield to a question please?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Sure.

SENATOR WHITNEY: If we fail to accept the committee amendments, I understand that is what is pending now.

PRESIDENT: That is correct sir.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Then Senator Carpenter's, ideas will be taken care of?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes, with one problem, and that is that the railroads would have a problem with the original, what Senator Carpenter's amendment would do and this I was going to be asking him at the proper time, is to be sure that we work a solution into the bill that would solve the railroads problem. But Senator Carpenter and I can get together later and with the railroad people and work that out.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: It would appear to me that the desirable thing to do then, rather than to accept these committee amendments and then have to get them out later would be to pass over the bill temporarily and have Senator Goodrich and Carpenter get together on this.

SENATOR CARPENTER: (mike not activated for the first part of statement) together on the amendment. I am not interested in the railroads. I like them and I eat their food, but not to this extent.

SENATOR WHITNEY: May I ask Senator Goodrich then another question.

PRESIDENT: Go ahead Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: In the light of what Senator Carpenter has just said, if we do not accept the committee amendments at all, then in your judgment, would this take care of Senator Carpenter's objection?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the committee amendments then? Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I will reject the committee amendments if that will mean that the effectiveness of the bill only applies to metropolitan cities, Omaha, this is the only one.

SENATOR GOODRICH: That is the way it would be if we reject the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to reject the committee amendments. Alright then, the motion before us now at this particular time is shall the committee amendments then be rejected to
