SENATOR CAVANAUGH: They would.

SENATOR WHITNEY: They would.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: They would. They would have to give notice of a public hearing ten days before the public hearing and the public hearing would have to be held 30 days before any consumation of the transaction.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Even though they were not using the right of eminent domain.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Right. In the case of any acquisition of property. There has to be a public hearing.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stull, and--then Senator Nore.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature. I'd like to clear up just one thing about what a legal newspaper is. It's my understanding that a legal newspaper is one that is designated by the Board of County Commissioners from each County when they reorganize their in January. And they will designate a certain newspaper or maybe more than one but that's how our paper is designated as a legal newspaper for that county.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator Stull. Senator Nore. We are still debating the Goodrich amendment.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President and fellow members, my only interest in this is the..to be sure that there's a notice in a generally read news media in the community where the property is located. Now is that the way..what we're doing now. Do we still do that? Or we may. Senator Cavanaugh.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh do you care to respond.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Sorry I didn't hear that.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore ask your question again.

SENATOR NORE: My interest in this is that it should be advertised in the generally read newspaper in the community where the property is located. Not the record.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: It has to be published in the newspaper of the county where the property is located.

SENATOR NORE: O.K.

PRESIDENT: Now is there any further discussion of the Goodrich amendment. All right, Senator Goodrich that clears the board back to you. What is your pleasure.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I move for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right. Any further discussion now of the Goodrich amendment. All those in fav of the Goodrich Amendment as amended by the Cavanaugh amendment will say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered. The Goodrich amendment is adopted then.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I move that the bill be advanced as amended.
