PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, may I ask Senator Carstens a question, please?

PRESIDENT: Senator Carstens yield.

SENATOR CARSTENS: Yes.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Does an individual owner of a unit in a condominium have the option to cooperate with others in buying insurance with the others, or not?

SENATOR CARSTENS: Yes, he does. He does have. This is the privilege granted in this bill. This is one of the things, but it does not limit him. Senator Whitney this is the distinction I want to make. He is not limited. If each of the common owners would get together and each have \$5,000 insurance on the contents of their apartment, for example, this.. anyone or all individuals may get additional insurance on their own

SENATOR WHITNEY: But he's not required to go in as a group based upon some kind of a majority rule?

SENATOR CARSTENS: No, no, no, no, no

SENATOR WHITNEY: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the bill? Question is then, shall there be, any closing remarks Senator Carstens?

SENATOR CARSTENS: I waive closing.

PRESIDENT: Alright, any.. Question is shall LB730 then be advanced from General File to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye all those opposed vote no. Motion is to advance the bill, LB730. Have you all voted? I'll wait for you Senator Goodrich, and Senator Stull. Once again, have you all voted. Clerk will record. I'm sorry Senator Schmit, didn't see you coming.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President in motion to advance.

PRESIDENT: Very good, bill is advanced. That brings up for General File Debate then LB704, Senator Warner.

CLERK: Legislative Bill 704 introduced by Senator Warner of the 25th District (read)

PRESIDENT: Alright, standby just a minute Senator Warner. We have visiting this morning from Lincoln seven students from Pershing School in Senator Barnett's district and they are up here, I believe in the north balcony.
