SENATOR STAHMER: Well, Senator Warner, to begin with the empty space we now have on the lot you're speaking of obviously could be used for parking and it appears rather anomaly to me, who is a man interested in history that we are going to perhaps allow to decay one of the true historic sites in the city, not provide for it's restoration which I personally think would make a great exhibit hall for all kinds of material and then in contrast will tear it down and then build a new building in the name of history. I wonder if we couldn't have this bill held for one week so that we could take a look at some possible alternatives, and if I'm wrong I certainly wouldn't want to hold up your proposition.

PRESIDENT: Standby, Senator Cal Carsten. Before you speak Senator Cal Carsten, the Chair would like to call to the attention of the body that we have a very distinguished visitor with us this morning. Seated under the south balcony, we have former Senator Elvin Adamson and I'm sure that the body would want to welcome him. Elvin would you step out and say hello to the fellows. Now, Senator Cal Carsten, we're still debating LB704, Senator Warner's bill.

SENATOR CAL CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the body, I rise in support of Senator Warner's bill. And I would also like to answer in my own way to Senator Stahmer. First of all I think that we suddenly find ourselves in the State of Nebraska realizing that we have too long let go many, many of the historical things that have been associated with Nebraska. And as we have witnessed in the last few years, space has been of the utmost importance and we have had to make changes from time to time and find ourselves again in a situation where we do not have the space. I think it is a timely bill and one that we certainly do need to support whole-heartedly. Now to Senator Stahmer, I think that we have to recognize that Mr. Marvin Kivet has looked at this problem in, I would hope in depth, and probably has taken into consideration your suggestion also Senator Stahmer, I do not know this for sure, but I'm sure, knowing Mr. Kivet that he has given it some consideration and I think that it is with his suggestion and encouragement that Senator Warner has come forth with the bill. I whole-heartedly support it and hope that the rest of the body will do likewise. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Next to speak is Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. As one that set on the committee and listened to this, I'd call it a plea from the people in this society. I can't see any reason why we would have to hold this up for a week. I would hope that we could get it under way and start this across and I think that anybody in this group would have to agree with Senator Stahmer, but we should try another method, or another way or another piece of Legislation. And maybe there is another piece that would be available to do what he is talking about. I think there is one little mistake that probably should be brought to the attention of the body in the committee report. Will the gentlemen down there listed as Otto Holtze, Junior from Humboldt is really Otto Kotouc, Junior. It must have been misunderstood as far as the committee is concerned, and I think he explained one of the biggest reasons that we should have this area set aside and one of the biggest reasons to have it in this position was the fact that it would be close to the Capitol, parking would be available, the Governor's Mansion across the street, and if we could get these things in one area centralized it would be a lot better for
