SENATOR MAHONEY: Well, Mr. President, it seems that on the north side of the aisle I have a friend that wishes to place me in that, so I'd like to substitute the motion and place Senator Carpenter's name there, because he would probably be the proper one.

PRESIDENT: Well that motion is out of order, but..Senator Snyder. Senator Snyder.

SENATOR SNYDER: Well I object because he has worked long and diligently on this and I think a man ought reap his rewards. He's got a lot of personal pride in this. I would object to what Senator Barnett was referring to.

PRESIDENT: Well we can either vote that motion up or down regarding Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR SNYDER: The motion is simply that Senator Mahoney be allowed to have his added as a co-introducer to LB 762, is that correct?

PRESIDENT: That's correct, that's the only issue before the house at this time. Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. Chairman, and members. I favor Senator Mahoney's name being put on the bill. I think he's been very wise for the simple reason his and the Carpenter amendment will benefit in our Federal State Highway Funds, the way they will be divided. Mass transit I understand will come out of our highway funds. He's looking down the road, and it will help Lincoln and Omaha, and Grand Island. So I think he is right on track as far as we're concerned. But the reason I voted against it, the amendment I was afraid it might take away some of our Federal State Highway Funds and divide them up with mass transit..

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore you are out of order. We are speaking only on the addition of Senator Mahoney's name to the bill. Now, is there any further discussion to that motion. Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President on one Senator's motion we have heard you have another one. Name added. The only thing I would like to hear is imput before I would vote on it would be Senator Clark as the principal introducer if he has any objection to the adding of Senator Mahoney's name.

PRESIDENT: Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: The only way I would have objection is if someone else is adding his name. If he wants his name added, I would certainly accept him. But I don't think that if some other Senator ought to put another man on it. If Senator Mahoney wants his name added, fine, I'll take it.

PRESIDENT: Well, the motion before us is the one made by Senator Snyder at this time, and it relates to Senator Mahoney's name and that's where are.

SENATOR CLARK: Could I ask Senator Mahoney a question?

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney yield to a question?

SENATOR CLARK: Do you want your name added to the bill?
