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to LB 762, with the Carpenter amendment, unless you have other amendments. Stand by. Now, it's the understanding of the Chair that there are no more amendments to this particular bill on the desk. Now, Senator Moylan has asked several times to speak and wants to speak only on the bill. Senator Moyland, I've given you a short shrift, but a lot has happened here.

SENATOR MOYLAN: I guess there has. Mr. President and members of the Legislature. The first thing I wanted to clarify is in the committee report it came out as a meeting absent. I heard the testimony on the bill, but I was called to another committee to introduce a bill at the time of Executive Session. Had I been there I would have voted to advance the bill. And I am in favor of the bill, if I might call it, we're back to the virgin bill now, that's the one I'm in favor of. We,

PRESIDENT: We're back there now.

SENATOR MOYLAN: No.

PRESIDENT: No, we have the Carpenter amendment to the bill.

SENATOR MOYLAN: Is it still on...Oh, it is isn't it.

PRESIDENT: It was adopted to 27 to 8.

SENATOR MOYLAN: Anyhow, I have been . . . have introduced a lot of legislation for the elderly. I did not like to get into this debate this morning because there is a question in my mind whether any of it is germane to the original bill. And there's still a question in my mind about that. But I have introduced, I've also introduced a resolution here, LB 108 for an interim study on the services for the aged. I hope the executive committee will refer it to a committee for an interim study to coordinate all the service for the aged. And I think we could care take for the transportation in that system. However, I am in favor of giving the elderly citizens that are in need of it, a rebate on their transportation. And with that, I will close my debate on this bill.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Stahmer is next to be heard. And then Senator Proud, and then Senator Nore. Passing, all right. Senator Proud, we are back to Senator Clark's original bill with the Carpenter amendment, now.

SENATOR PROUD: Yes, I have a question of Senator Clark.

PRESIDENT: Senator Clark yield.

SENATOR PROUD: And I must admit that perhaps I missed something in the various debates on the bill, but Senator Clark has clearly stated and the committee statement so states that LB 762 removed from the control of the Public Service Commission, motor vehicles etc. removes from the control of the Public Service Commission. Now Senator Clark, I may have missed this, but I've never heard it explained why you want to take it from the control of the Public Service Commission. I am not objecting to that I just simply want to know why.

SENATOR CLARK: In the first place I would like to tell Senator Moylan this is not a virgin bill. This is an impregnated bill. Now, there's a difference in the first place. The reason that we wanted to take this out in the first place is that we go out
