

is riding a bicycle after January 1, 1976, without this reflective material on it, I will be willing to accept it.

SENATOR BARNETT: What I am thinking of is that the reflective material if you put the sticky tape on, it will come off. I have a fourteen year old son that rides a bike. I'm thinking now that if the courts would fine him \$5, I'd make him pay it but I think that he would have to work or find a job somewhere which he doesn't have at fourteen years old. I would just as soon have the judge or the court get his attention by saying, you are to write a thousand word essay and appear here two or three times and start learning to obey the law, instead of a monetary thing. I don't think that monetary things don't prevent these things so often because wealthy parents can go ahead and pay the child's fine and he ignores the law. I think that we should get the attention of the person who violates the law, and I hate to ask to hold it but....I would throw this at you for a suggestion or somebody's discussion. I am really serious about this. I think that we should get to the child that is going to be involved and somehow let them be responsible for the penalty of not maintaining this.

SENATOR MOYLAN I know that you have a point there alright, and if you can come up with the a...a..with this section in the bill, that will put a penalty on here that will make the law more or less effective, I would be willing to accept it. The wording would have to be...

SENATOR BARNETT: Would you be against bracketing the bill until about next Wednesday or Thursday or as soon as we can...give us time over the week end to come up with this Senator Moylan. Maybe we can even come with an idea that the manufacturers should do it.

SENATOR MOYLAN: I want to explain here now that the bicycles with the caliber brake, really should have the tires that are now being manufactured with a rim of reflective tape build into them similar to that of a white wall tire, which in the light of a car, balloons in size and can be seen up to six hundred feet.

SENATOR BARNETT: This is some bikes you say?

SENATOR MOYLAN: That is the one with the caliber brakes where the hand brakes rubs on the tire. Now the others can use this reflective tape because it will stick...there is a quality tape that will stick to the tires if they have the

conventional brake. However these caliber brakes of course would tend to rub that off. But it has been suggested that it can be put on the rim if necessary. However there are tires that are being manufactured by the Goodyear Company at least, and I don't know if others are or not, but there are several states that have this law now and New York is the principle one. These tires are not too expensive. They could run from depending upon the caliber of bike that you have \$2-5 was the figure mentioned.
