

SENATOR MOYLAN: I just wish to say that I am certainly agreeable with that amendment.

PRESIDENT: Then we actually have Senator Kremer's amendment to the bill which would take off the \$5 and set a limit of \$15. That would be the limitation in the bill. The limit of the fine. Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: May I ask one thing? Could it, is it possible that I could take and pass over this bill and take 10 minutes and come together with Senator Kremer and Senator Moylan and maybe work this out so we don't have to hold it up. Could we ask for that consideration?

PRESIDENT: Sure, fine.

SENATOR BARNETT: Would that be alright with you? Lets do that then, lets pass over it for about 10 minutes.

PRESIDENT: Stand by. Just a minute. Senator Barnett is asking unanimous consent to pass over the bill for a few minutes here to counsel with Senator Kremer and Senator Moylan are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered. We will pass it over and go to the next bill. That will bring up LB8.--.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk. Read motion. Mr. President, I also have a reference committee report, read. Read motion regarding LB702.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature these are the two bills that Senator Luedtke tried to have introduced yesterday. Senator Whitney did have them introduced this morning and I would ask that the rules be suspended and that there would still be 6 days notice of a hearing a instead of the usual 7.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion now which would be to suspend the rules to have a hearing set on the two bills which were introduced this morning. Is there need for further discussion of that motion? Then the question is, shall the rules be suspended and the two bills set for a hearing? All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. This is a motion to suspend the rules so that the two bills that were introduced this morning can be set for public hearing. Senator Stull for what.....

SENATOR STULL: (mike not activated) a call on the house for this but we would like to have this or these bills get enough votes so that the hearing can be set. We have room this next Wednesday to hear these bills.

PRESIDENT: Keep talking Senator Stull, as long as you have the floor I can't close it off. Could the Chair have your attention please? This motion does require 30 votes and it is to suspend the rules so that the two bills that were introduced this morning can be set for public hearing. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion prevails and we will set the bills for hearing. Any other motions on the desk.
