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the bill which would have attempted to observe Memorial and Veterans Days on Mondays rather than on their assigned dates. So I would ask for the rules to be suspended and LB 777 withdrawn and the public hearing canceled. I think this item I believe would generate enough interest in the media that people would be aware that the bill had been withdrawn and where no public hearing would be held.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, I suppose at this point I should speak on a point of special privilege. I'm aware that we are following the right procedure in suspending the rules to do this. But the notice of the hearings have already been published in the official newspapers and there could be people coming in, and I think we need to watch very carefully what we are doing and not giving folks who may be interested in the bill time to be notified that the bill has been withdrawn and I'm not objecting to it, but I think we need to watch this and do it in time so that the public can be informed.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion of the motion?  
Senator Fred Carstens do you want to discuss the motion?  
Senator Marsh for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR MARSH: I have a question for the Senator who made the motion, please.

PRESIDENT: Senator Snyder yield?

SENATOR SNYDER: Yes.

SENATOR MARSH: Is it your understanding that there isn't anyone in Nebraska who desires this proposal anymore?

SENATOR SNYDER: No, that is not my understanding, Senator Marsh, but my understanding is that with myself I do not wish to support the change. I would bow out if someone else would want--to put their name on the bill. And that's why I hopefully have made the point here this morning, I'm not trying to sneak a bill out and do away with it. But I've had second thoughts concerning the move to return the holidays to a Monday status as opposed to leaving them on the date they are now observed. If any other member of the Legislature wants to put their name on LB 777 and carry the bill that is fine, otherwise because I will now oppose it. But if someone else wants their name on the bill, go right ahead.

SENATOR MARSH: Question of the Chair. I have pending bills which I've introduced. Is it possible to put..I mean ten bills..Is it possible to my name on this when I already have ten bills that I introduced originally? Or is it possible to put my name on this because the original Senator does not want his name on it longer.

PRESIDENT: The Chair is not aware of any way in which the rules of the Legislature can be stretched in that category. The limitation on bills in ten and that is pretty final. These rules of the Legislature. If you have a committee. If you have some other source, that fine, but the Chair would not allow that under these circumstances.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Snyder.
