PRESIDENT: Yes, this ruling was only as an individual. The committee was not involved at all. That's correct. Now, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, what is the number of the bill under discussion?

PRESIDENT: 777.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I have ten bills, I move that my name be placed on LB777.

PRESIDENT: Now, hold on, just a minute...we have to.. just a minute here... We'll announce the vote on the ruling of the Chair.

CLERK: Shall I record the vote or what?

PRESIDENT: Record the vote, yes.

CLERK: 2 ayes, 29 nays.

PRESIDENT: Thank you then the Chair is sustained in the ruling, now we're back to Senator Snyder's original motion which is to suspend the rules and withdraw LB777. Now Senator Snyder what is your pleasure regarding that motion. Senator Chambers has made a motion now to take over the bill.

SENATOR SNYDER: I think everyone knows what we're doing. I call for the question. This is to withdraw LB777.

PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Kennedy, do you still have a question?

SENATOR KENNEDY: Would this be an opportunity to also ask about whether a committee can take over an individual's bill?

PRESIDENT: The Chair would prefer not to do that at this time. I've got enough troubles here. Question is now, shall the rules be suspended and the public hearing be cancelled and Senator Snyder be allowed to withdraw LB777. All those in favor of suspending the rules for the withdrawal of that bill, vote aye, all those opposed vote no. This is the motion for suspension of the rules, so Senator Snyder be allowed to withdraw LB777. Have you all voted? Once again the Chair would inquire if you have all voted. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 3 nays, 16 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion prevails then and Senator Snyder is allowed to withdraw LB777. Are there other motions on the desk.

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, I move to suspend the rules and introduce the attached four bills in behalf of the Banking Committee, signed Senator Carstens.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Fred Carstens.

SENATOR FRED CARSTENS: Mr. President and members of the committee, I have had these bills, three of them were prepared at the request of the Insurance Department. The bills came out and I'm very reluctant to introduce bills this late, but there was no way that
