

human rights and the means that people will resort to when the government is unresponsive, I want to bring into sharp focus and into context that you can understand now because you are dealing with something that touches you and those that mean something to you. You are talking about taking hogs to market, cattle to market and the expense of rigs fine. My children mean more to me than all of the cattle, all of the pigs, and all of the truck rigs in the universe. So if these men or anyone else is justified in using violence or whatever means that would be decided in self help to get a right to earn a living, understand what I would do to help my children get some freedom. Now when I bring bills before this body, they will never equal in number of intensity or call the bills that I collectively support that I support that are collectively brought in by this body and I'll support any group of people that need help. But I want you to think now, why you fell this a bit, feel something for me, feel something for the people that I represent, for the children that have no voice here other than mine. If violence is justified where the truckers are concerned, it has got to be justified where my freedoms and the welfare of my children, and all children is concerned. So if violence is right in one context in where government fails to respond then it has got to be justifiable in another. But we are saying here this morning is that there is action that a governmental body can take to present violence to even do away with the need of it to provide some machinery to solve some very difficult and complex human problems without taking to the street with guns. I am willing to help do this for the trucker and even the oil companies who I feel are the criminals. The problem exists and it must be solved now. We can place blame later. Some of us will place it as we go along. While we give the truckers machinery whereby they can earn a living give me some machinery to get some freedom.
